At the outset, the Chairman welcomed all the members of Board of Studies and the following decisions were taken:

Item No.1: Confirmation of proceedings of 220th meeting of BOS.

Item No.2: Approval of course curriculum of “Diploma in Veterinary Laboratory Technician”

A proposal to start a “Vety. Lab. Technician Diploma” was proposed to be introduced in the college. The course curriculum and its contents were discussed in detail and referred to a sub-committee under the Chairmanship of Dr.S.K.Chawla, HOD, Vety. Surgery in its 218th meeting of BOS held on 2/9/11. The committee suggested certain suggestions/modifications. The title of the aforesaid diploma will be “Diploma in Veterinary Laboratory Technician” and its minimum eligibility qualifications will be 10+2 (science stream) as already approved by the BOM in its Ist meeting held on 4/1/12, vide item No.11, proceedings of the same circulated vide No.R-3/2012/143-55 dt. 9.1.2012. The proposal was approved as proposed.

Item No.3: Approval of course curriculum of “Veterinary Laboratory Technician Diploma” submitted by International Institute of Vety. Education & Research, Bahu Akbarpur, Distt. Rohtak:

A proposal was received from the Director General of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Haryana for approval of curriculum for the “Vety. Laboratory Technician Diploma”. The agenda was put up in the BOS in its 220th meeting held on 14/12/11 for its approval and the Board suggested that

similar diploma was proposed to be started by LLRUVAS and the course curriculum and contents of both the Diploma Programmes should be the same with same nomenclature. Therefore, it was decided that the course curriculum and contents of the course approved for the diploma in LLRUVAS, may be approved and forwarded to the Director General of Animal Husbandry & Dairying, Institute of Vety. Education & Research, Bahu Akbarpur, Distt. Rohtak

Item No.4: Starting of Diploma course entitled “Diploma in Dairy Technology”

The Prof. & Head, Dept. of LPT, LLRUVAS, has submitted a proposal to start a diploma entitled “Diploma in Dairy Technology” (DIDT). However, the fee structure will be the same as VLDD programme as under:

The members felt that the course curriculum and contents which have been made for one year, whereas it should be two years diploma course keeping in view the contents of the course to commensurate the basic needs of this diploma programme. Therefore, the Prof.& Head, Dept.of LPT was requested to re-structure the course curriculum and contents which may be sufficient for two years. The agenda was deferred.

Item No.5: Offering of interdisciplinary courses VPP-322, VMD-512 and VMD-513.

The above said courses are interdisciplinary courses involving various departments including Vety. Pathology and Vety. Medicine. It was decided that these courses will be henceforth be taught as under:

The faculty of the department of Veterinary Pathology agreed to teach component of Veterinary Medicine in course VPP-322 which will now be offered by the departments of Vety.Pathology and L.P.M. Similarly, the faculty of the Department of Veterinary Medicine agreed to teach Veterinary Pathology component of two courses namely VMD-512 and VMD-513 which will now be offered jointly by the departments of Vety. Medicine, Animal Genetics & Breeding, Livestock Production Management, Animal Nutrition and Veterinary Surgery & Radiology.

Item No. 6: Improvement of Standard of Examination System for B.V.Sc.& A.H. programme

The BOS in its 219th meeting held on 14/11/11 at 2.15 p.m. discussed in detail regarding the improvement of standard of examination system for BVSc & AH and formulated a sub-committee under the chairmanship of Controller of Examination - Dr.S.K.Gupta. The suggestions/modifications given by the sub-committee were discussed in detail and five amendments were made in the existing rules as shown in the Annexure A. The format for the internal and external examination was also approved as proposed (copy enclosed).

Item No.7: Education/study tour of the students:

At present the amount for tour programmes for the North India tour is Rs.750/- per student and no. of days is 5 to the maximum of 10 days while the South India tour, the amount is Rs.1250/- per student and no. of days is 10 days respectively. It was felt that keeping in view the inflation rates and increase in the fuel charges, the amount may be revised to Rs.1000/- for North India tour and Rs.1500/- for South India tour. However, the no. of days for tour programme will remain the same.
