Agenda item No.71 RIC-1: Confirmation of the proceedings of the 70th meeting held on 08.04.2025.

Agenda item No.71 RIC-2: Action taken report on the proceedings of 70th meeting held on 08.04.2025.

Agenda Item No. 71 RIC-3: To review the provisions contained under Rule 9.4 of Chapter III A of University Calendar Volume II.

It is submitted that ICAR-BSMA PG Course Curriculum and Common Academic Regulations have been implemented in the University w.e.f. Academic Year 2023-24 after obtaining approval of the competent authority. In this context, Chapter III A has been included in University Calendar Volume II which is applicable to the PG students admitted in the Academic Year 2023-24 and onwards.

As per provisions contained under Rule 9.4 of Chapter III A of UCV II which is reproduced is as under:

“Dean, PGS may accept the result up to seven credit hours of research along with thesis seminar certificate, panel of examiners and thesis after mid-term examination of last semester of residential requirement.”

In view of the above, only those students can deliver their thesis seminar after mid-term examination of last semester of residential requirement who are left with less than or equal to seven credit hours of research work.

Now some student requested that the Programme of Work usually prepared by the end of 1st semester of study, hence maximum credit load can't be offered in 1st semester. So, teaching

course may continue upto 3rd semester for the most of students. Thus, in the most of cases, credit hours of research work remain more than seven in last semester of residential requirement.

In view of the above, proposed amendment in Rule 9.4 of Chapter III A of University Calendar Volume II is as under:

The RIC discussed the matter at length and recommended to place the matter before the worthy Vice-Chancellor for approval subject to the ratification by the Academic Council in its ensuing meeting.

Agenda Item No. 71 RIC-4: Proposed amendment in Rule 24.2 of Chapter III A of University Calendar Volume II.

As per provision contained under Rule 24.2 of Chapter III A of University Calendar Volume II,

“Each Professor/equivalent and Associate Professor/equivalent can guide up to four PG students as Major/Co-Major Advisor at a time.”

In this regard, HoDs of some departments informed telephonically that it creates confusion during the allotment of PG students to the faculty members as Major /Co-Major Advisor. For example, if a student is allotted to a faculty member to guide as Co-Major Advisor, whether it should be counted in the maximum limit of four students per faculty member or not?

Inadvertently, Major/Co-Major Advisor is used in above mentioned rules instead of Major Advisor. But for all purpose Co-Major may be treated as member from Major Subject when both are from LUVAS faculty.

In view of the position explained above, following amendment is proposed in rule 24.2 of Chapter III A of University Calendar Volume II
