Terms and Conditions:

1. The engagement will be co-terminus with project. However, in case the work and conduct are not found satisfactory, the services can be terminated at any time after giving due opportunity of being heard to the concerned manpower. If the selected

candidate wants to leave, he/she can do so after giving 15 days' notice in writing to the department.

2. On account of paucity of funds, the services can be terminated at any time.
3. He/she will be entitled to TA/DA as per rules.
4. On expiry of the term of project, he/she will be relieved and the university/department will not be responsible of his/her adjustment in university.
5. He/she will not be regular employee of the university and would not be entitled for any CPF/GPF or any other benefit admissible to the regular employee.
6. He/she will be required to produce a medical certificate to fitness from the CMO of this University at the time of joining.
7. He/she would report for duty within 10 days from the date to issue of the order failing which his/her engagement will be treated as withdrawn.
8. The University shall not bear any liability in the event of the demise of any engaged personnel during their period of engagement with the University
9. His/her place of work will be the concerned Department or any other place as deputed by Principal Investigator.
10. He/she will be required to execute an agreement on non-judicial stamp paper of Rs.10/- before he/she is allowed to join the position.
11. Salary will be paid on receipt of the funds from funding agency.
