Research articles to be published from the students theses should, invariably have following sequence in authorship : 1. The student 2. The Major Advisor 3. The Co-major Advisor (if any) 4. Other contributors, in order of their contribution.	(d) For submission of M.V.Sc. thesis, one research paper should have been submitted and for submission of Ph.D. thesis two research papers should have been submitted for publication in a scientific journal OR a patent application submitted / filed out of the in M. V. Sc. / Ph. D. research work will be considered equivalent to one research publication of his/her thesis work. The application for patent should be considered and approved for submission by the IPRM &C Core Group as per LUVAS Patent Rules. Research articles to be published from the students thesis should, invariably have following sequence in authorship : 1. The student 2. The Major Advisor 3. The Co-major Advisor (if any). 4. Other contributors, in order of their contribution. Patent submitted out of research work should have authorship as per LUVAS patent rules. “This Rule will be applicable from the Academic Year 2019-20”.
